# Toronto's By-Election for Mayor

## STEP 1: Apply For Mail-in Voting

- Starting May 1, visit [toronto.ca/VoteByMail](https://toronto.ca/VoteByMail)
- Deadline to apply is Friday, May 26 at 4:30 p.m.

## STEP 2: Complete Your Package

Once approved, starting on May 23 you will be sent a Mail-in Voting package to complete.

- **SIGN** the Declaration Form
- **MARK** the Ballot
- **INSERT** the sealed Secrecy Envelope into the Yellow Return Envelope

## STEP 3: Mail Your Package

- Take your completed package to any Canada Post mailbox or hand deliver it to one of the yellow drop boxes.
- Each ward will have one yellow drop box available starting June 1. Locations are listed at: [toronto.ca/VoteByMail](https://toronto.ca/VoteByMail).
- Completed packages must be received by **noon (12 p.m.) on June 15.**

# Accessible Elections

Toronto Elections is committed to ensuring that persons with disabilities have equal access to vote privately and independently in all municipal elections and by-elections.



## **Mail-In Voting**

## **Curbside Voting**

If you are physically unable to go inside the voting place, have someone ask for your ballot to be brought to your vehicle or a spot outside of the building.

## **Personal Assistance**

Bring a friend to assist you in the voting place or ask an election official for help.

## **Voter Assist Terminal (VAT)**

This ballot-marking device allows voters with disabilities to vote privately and independently using various assistive devices. There will be a VAT available at every advance vote location and at two locations per ward on election day.

## **Appoint a Proxy Voter**

Someone who is eligible to vote in the city of Toronto by-election and trusted to vote on your behalf.
