Elected yesterday to the Board was Gideon Arthurs (Soulpepper Theatre Company), and transitioning from Vice-President to President Michael Sinclair.

The TAPA AGM was well attended at the Tarragon Theatre Extraspace, where TAPA launched their new five-year Strategic Plan, presented by Parul Pandya, Founder and Community Consultant, of the Community Impact Consulting Group. The new Strategic Plan is anchored by five core values that lead TAPA: Equity, Advocacy, Engagement, Membership, Collaboration and Resilience. "I am excited to be working together with the TAPA Board and TAPA staff team to help us to accomplish the goals that we have set-out in our new Strategic Plan," proclaimed new TAPA Board President, Michael Sinclair.

Lastly, Jacoba Knaapen was recognized yesterday for her twenty-year anniversary as Executive Director at TAPA. "It is an honour to serve the diverse TAPA membership. I look forward to 2024 and sharing our new home at B Street with the community and continuing to work together with the Board, TAPA team and membership to help to strengthen and support our sector."
