# LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

**Tyler J Sloane** (they/he/she) is a multidisciplinary artist with a focus on performance arts and media arts, and has a foundation in theatre as an actor, producer, and director. Their first practice was visual arts, where their practice in digital art and collage first arose. They are a mixed race person being Ojicree-Anishinaabe, British, French, Scottish, Irish, and Chinese. This piece is called "why here."

#### **ARTIST STATEMENT**

We live in a glass city, made of minerals and metals from all across this world, over top of water ways. Often, I feel like that rush and hustle of the city - while definitely capitalism - is also the rush of this place as a water way. I moved to this city in a braid; for my artistry - acting, for my identity, and for my ethnic culture. Toronto is hard, ephemeral summers and bitter winters, so much culture, so much exhaustion. I didn't anticipate that theatre and actors would usher me into the mix and vibrancy of this city, and yet they did. From them connecting me to other artistic communities and activists - to folks who also had a deep and insatiable interest in culture. Within that I learned about acknowledging your history, and who was here before. So, we usher people in with land acknowledgements, and this visualisation art piece personifies mine - as part of many steps in doing so.

Toronto is identified as a melting pot of culture, as a beacon of art, as a place where the trees grow in water, as a place stolen.

#### We see...

- a collage of photos of Lake Ontario, the sky, and Toronto's Skyline all taken over the current duration of my time here (2016-2024). All moments acknowledging my wonder and gratitude for this place.
- 1Sun, setting north west, warm like the Torontohenge, with the Condor (L) and Eagle (R) over on the horizon upon us.
- 7 Fires, echoing the 7 Fire's Prophecy, an acknowledgment of Anishininabe migration from the east coast up into the north west around the great lakes. Also homage to Yolanda Bonnell, one of my dear friends and kin who has given me so much knowledge about this place!
- The Strawberry moon rising in the east, admittedly my favourite fruit, but also as a sign that even when it can be the most dark our compassion from our Ode (hearts) can carry us through.
- · The four squares as a nod to the Haudenosaunee flag.
- A vibrant blue skyline, around blue skies, with the sun setting a red reflective harbour. An
  acknowledgement that the beauty and charisma of this city, lies on severe colonial truths and
  violence. Storytellers who make the harsh and serious realities of being good visitors easier with the
  gift of stories on the stage, with text, with song, or just with the lift of our hands.
- A snapshot of the map of Toronto or a portion rather to remind us of the specificity of being a
  part of the bigger picture.
- The Dora Mavor Moore statue standing in water, while a shot of light pours through; acknowledging that it is storytellers who make the harsh and serious realities of being good visitors easier with the gift of stories on the stage, with text, with song, or just with the lift of our hands.



TAPA is pleased to unveil a visualization of our land acknowledgement by Tyler J. Sloane. TAPA is grateful for and acknowledges the sacred land on which we work, live and play. The land and waterways in this area have been the site of human activity for over 15,000 years and is ancestral territory called Tkaronto, "where the trees stand in the water." Tkaronto is a gathering place of many nations and peoples past and present, recorded and unrecorded, including: the Wendat, the Haudenosaunee, and the Anishinaabe, including the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation.

Tkaronto was subject to the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant to peaceably share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes. We acknowledge this treaty was ignored and disregarded.

At the end of the last ice age, the land that we work on was flooded as the glaciers melted, becoming ancient Lake Iroquois. Just up the street, our office at B Street, what we now know as Davenport Road was the shoreline and a trail known as "Gete-Onigaming," Ojibwe for "at the old portage," came into being to travel between the Humber and Don River. This route served many diverse people, just as we intend to serve the various diverse communities through B Street.

We acknowledge and reference the global oppression of colonialism that is ongoing and we stand in solidarity with the First Nations, Metis, and Inuit communities who continue to seek liberation and decolonization within the colonial project of Canada.

### **DORA AWARDS STATUETTE**

The Dora Awards reflect a range of work across 7 divisions and 43 categories presented by 155 professional theatre, dance, and opera member companies and individual artsworkers in Toronto. In 2019, a new Dora statuette was unveiled to better reflect current artistic practices being presented on Toronto stages. The Dora Awards statuette was originally re-imagined by designer Trevor Schwellnus, craftsperson fina macDonell and glass artist Kirei Samuel.

The Artist Statement: This project is a sculptural love letter to the Toronto arts community – a community whose ambition and positive support has given remarkable strength to present and future generations of artists. Our city is named from the Haudenosaunee word 'Tkaronto' which has been translated as "where there are trees standing in the water". The design features



an anthropomorphic figure, without gender or ethnic reference, which emerges tree-like from a base of watery glass. Its four roots, pointing to the four directions, turn upwards into a trunk - or torso - then reach above the figure's head in a circle - a symbol with many associations across a variety of cultures, including togetherness, equality, cycles - even a spotlight. The form is open to the viewer; to celebrate a community that has created a cultural spirit strong enough to delve into difficult issues with honesty and integrity. The arts are not an industry, nor a business - they are activities carried out by collaborators learning to dream together. This figure is a dream symbol for that spirit.

### HISTORY

The Dora Mavor Moore Awards, named for Dora Mavor Moore and presented by TAPA, were founded on December 13, 1978 by a committee convened by Millie Drain. On that date Drain and the other founders (Ann Antkiw, Ronald Bryden, Bill Glassco, Graham Harley, Leon Major, Sean Mulcahy, Peter Peroff, Heinar Piller, Susan Rubes, Pat Stewart and Sylvia Tucker), decided to institute an award to recognize outstanding achievements in Toronto theatre.

Today the Doras honour the creators of approximately 200 theatre, dance and opera productions annually in 43 categories over 7 Divisions: General Theatre, Independent Theatre, Musical Theatre, Theatre for Young Audiences, Dance, Opera and Touring. The awards in each division are voted on by a jury of eight to twelve individuals each, drawn from the professional performing arts community.





#### ABOUT DORA MAVOR MOORE

Born in Glasgow in 1888, teacher and director Dora Mavor Moore arrived in Toronto eight years later. She devoted her long life to creating theatre and theatre companies in her new home. Her contributions to Canadian professional theatre are immeasurable.

Dora Mavor Moore was the founder of the University Extension Players and the Hart House Touring Players with the innovative playwright and teacher Herman Voaden.

In 1938, she formed the Village Players to tour Shakespeare to Ontario high schools. She was also the mother of three sons, including well-known actor, author and critic, Mavor Moore.

Her New Play Society is remembered for its annual satiric revue Spring Thaw (1948 to 1971). In its twenty-five years, the company presented some 200 plays including many new Canadian works.

In 1949, the New Play Society mounted the first Canadian play ever to run at the Royal Alexandra Theatre (To Tell the Truth by Morley Callaghan).

Dora Mavor Moore was instrumental in bringing Tyrone Guthrie to Canada to found the Stratford Shakespearean Festival.

A recipient of many awards and honours, including the Order of Canada (1970), Dora Mavor Moore was truly one of the key founders of professional theatre in Canada and a fitting namesake for Toronto's professional theatre awards.

# **PAULINE McGIBBON AWARD**

was established by the Government of Ontario in 1981 to honour Ontario's first female Lieutenant Governor, who passed away in late 2001 at the age of 91. Mrs. McGibbon was a much loved public figure who promoted the arts during her tenure as Lieutenant Governor between 1974 and 1980, and was a supporter of the theatre in Ontario all her life. Administered by the Ontario Arts Council, the award consists of \$7,000 from the Ministry of Culture and a medal designed by Dora de Pedery Hunt, and is awarded on a three-year cycle to a designer, director and theatre craftsperson. The Award is a fitting tribute to the late Mrs. McGibbon – it is given to an emerging theatre artist who has displayed unique talent and a potential for excellence.

**Tawiah Ben M'Carthy** was born in Accra, Ghana, where he was introduced to multidisciplinary theatre, and is now a Toronto-based theatre performer, playwright, creator and director. As a theatre artist, Tawiah often employs both West African and Western theatre practices, combining the art of storytelling, text, movement and rituals with staging, design and characterization.

He trained as an actor in the Acting Conservatory Bachelor of Fine Arts program at York University and went on to perform in works like Three Sisters (Soulpepper/Obsidian Theatre), Sizwe Banzi Is Dead (Soulpepper Theatre) and Maanomaa, My Brother (Blue Bird Theatre Collective/Canadian Stage).

Tawiah's practice as a director began in 2016. He continued to develop his directing skills through hands-on mentorship and internship experiences at Obsidian Theatre, Shaw Theatre Festival, and Factory Theatre. Tawiah was also an artistic director intern at Canadian Stage with the support of the Metcalf Foundation.

He is the creator, playwright, and performer of the critically acclaimed Dora Mavor Moore Award-winning play Obaaberima, which was developed and produced in residency at Buddies in Bad Times Theatre.

Tawiah is a founding member of Saga Collectif and co-founder and co-artistic director of Blue Bird Theatre Collective.

# RAY FERRIS INNOVATION AND SUSTAINABILITY GRANT

The Ray Ferris Innovation and Sustainability Grant is an annual grant awarded to a Toronto-based producing company selected by the committee based on a detailed production/project proposal, recognizing advances in theatrical design and the promotion of sustainability in live theatre. The recipient receives a cash grant of \$25,000 towards innovative sustainability elements for an in-person live theatre performance. The Ontario Arts Foundation manages the endowment that funds the grant.

The OAF and TAPA are delighted to announce that Common Boots Theatre and Bad New Days are this year's recipients of the annual \$25,000 Ray Ferris Innovation and Sustainability Grant for their production of *Last Landscape*, as was announced at the Dora Press Conference on May 28, 2024.

A central part of that commitment is to partner with a not-for-profit theatre company to make Weston's new performing arts centre its new home.

The northwest part of Toronto and in particular the old village of Weston has been economically neglected, and over the years, it has fallen into decay despite having an energetic community of civic minded residents. Except for a few promising spots, Weston has become a cultural desert. A recent community survey conducted by the local resident's association revealed that the majority of participants want Weston to have a thriving cultural centre.

Weston is now on the verge of an economic boom. Development is coming in a big way. The area is expected to welcome more than 7,000 new residents in the next 5 years and many more after that. The next step is to address the urgent need for cultural infrastructure.

The people of Weston and its community stakeholders have delivered a strong mandate for arts and cultural renewal. The Romano D'Andrea Foundation is committed to working with the city, the residents of Weston, the development community, the Toronto arts community and other stakeholders to deliver on this promise and make Weston the next great home for the performing arts in Toronto.





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

#### **RULES & REGULATIONS**

Condensed from Dora Mavor Moore Awards: Eligibility Criteria & Rules and Regulations.

Eligibility Year Productions opening after May 15, 2023 and with 60% of eligible performances occurring before May 15, 2024 were eligible for the 44th Annual Dora Mayor Moore Awards.

**JURIES** Dora jurors are appointed by the Dora Jury Selection Committee, which includes representatives from each of the Dora Divisions, and approved by the TAPA Board of Directors. TAPA member companies are invited to nominate individuals to be considered by the Dora Jury Selection Committee. Juries are comprised of twelve individuals in each Division. All Dora Juries are meticulously cast to reflect the greatest diversity of age, gender identity, experience, race, ability, language, craft and culture, of the Toronto performing arts community. Jurors are not remunerated for their time or for costs incurred from attending eligible performances. Jurors meet two to four times per year to review and discuss eligible productions in their Division.

**ATTENDANCE** Jury members may not vote for productions they have not attended at any stage of voting. This applies to productions that jurors may have seen previously, as the remount may not be identical to the original production. Attendance must be substantiated with Jury Chairs. Juror attendance records will be provided to the Dora Manager, who will verify that jurors have not voted for productions they have not attended. If a juror votes for a production they have not attended or for which they have not provided substantiation, their entire vote in that category will be dismissed.

**CONFLICT OF INTEREST** Jurors must state if they have a conflict of interest in any production registered in their Division. For the purposes of the DMMA, a conflict of interest is defined as (but not limited to) the following: (a) when a juror participates (paid or unpaid) as part of a registered production's administrative, creative, and/or technical team; (b) when a juror is employed by the production company/companies that registered the production or is a member of its governing body; or (C) when a juror is related by birth or marriage, including Common Law status, to any individual who meets criteria (a) and (b). The Jury Chair for the Division will record any conflict of interest. Jurors who have a conflict of interest with a registered production may not vote for that production in the first round of voting, which creates the short-list. Should the production appear on the short-list after the first round of voting, the juror with the conflict may vote for the production in the second and third ballots.

**VOTING PROCEDURES** No member of the jury may abstain from voting in any category, excepting the first round, nor may they vote for fewer than the prescribed number of candidates in any one category. Jury members may not vote for productions they have not attended. Should a jury member fail to submit a ballot during any round of voting, they will not be permitted from voting in any remaining rounds, including tie-breakers.

There must be a minimum of two (2) eligible candidates in a category in order to proceed with voting. Voting must proceed in all three rounds as long as the minimum of two (2) eligible candidates is met. In the event of insufficient eligible candidates in a category, no award will be given in that category for that season. In such a situation, the producer may register the same production, should it be remounted (even within the 5 year minimum) in any subsequent seasons, in any/all categories in which no award was given. They will retain their original eligibility status.

Once voting has begun, in the event that a registered candidate in any award category in any Division at any stage of the voting process chooses to withdraw their candidacy from consideration, the candidate in question shall be removed from the ballot without substitution. Withdrawn short-listed and nominated candidates shall NOT be replaced by the next runner-up. In the event of only one (1) eligible candidate remaining in a category due to withdrawals, no award will be given in that category for that season. In such a situation, the producer may register the same production, should it be remounted (even within the 5 year minimum) in any subsequent seasons, in any/all categories in which no award was given. They will retain their original eligibility status.

**FIRST ROUND (short list):** Each juror will receive an emailed ballot with the full list of eligible candidates in every category. Each juror shall short list a minimum of one (1) and a maximum of five (5) candidates in each category, with eight (8) in all Performance by an Individual categories. Jurors may choose to abstain in a category during this round.

Jurors with a conflict of interest with an eligible production *may not* vote for that production in any category in this round of voting.

The Dora Manager shall tabulate the votes of each jury in every category. Every candidate named by any juror shall be included on the short list.

**SECOND ROUND (nominees):** Each juror will receive an emailed ballot with the short-listed candidates for each category. Each juror shall vote by attributing points to their top five (5) choices (top eight (8) for all Performance by an Individual categories) in the following manner; five (5) points for first choice, four (4) points for second choice, three points (3) for third choice, two (2) points for fourth choice and one (1) point for fifth choice.

Jurors must assign all 5 levels of points, and may not enter the same number twice. The identical process will be applied to all performance individual categories, with eight (8) as first choice and so on.

Jurors with a conflict of interest with an eligible production may vote for that production in any category in this round of voting.

The Dora Manager shall tabulate the votes of each jury in every category. The nominees shall be the first five (5) eligible candidates (eight (8) in all performance by an individual categories) to receive the highest point score. In the event of a (or several) tie(s), nominees in excess of the allotted spots will be dropped. The minimum number of nominees shall be two (2), and maximum number of nominees shall not exceed five (5) and eight (8) for all performance categories. In the case of a five-way tie (or more) for second place or a four-way tie for third place, the tie shall be broken by first tabulating the number of jurors who voted for each candidate. If this does not break the tie, then the points attributed to each remaining tied candidate shall be switched to ordinals, which shall be tabulated identically to the third round of voting.

**THIRD ROUND (recipients):** Each juror will receive an emailed ballot containing a list of nominees in each category. Each juror shall rank the nominees in the following order: first (1st) place to their first choice, second (2nd) place to their second choice, third (3rd) place to their third choice.


Jurors must assign all three (3) levels of places, and may not enter the same placing twice.

Jurors with a conflict of interest with an eligible production *may* vote for that production in any category in this round of voting.

The Dora Manager shall tabulate the votes of each jury in each category. The recipients in each category of each Division shall be the nominee receiving the greatest number of weighted votes, with "1st place" receiving 4 points, "2nd place" receiving 2 points and "3rd place" receiving 1 point.

**TIE-BREAKERS:** In the event of a tie, each juror will be sent a tie-breaking ballot where they are asked to select one (1) of two (2) or more candidates. If this measure does not break the tie, the Jury Captain's vote will be used to break the tie in confidence. The Jury Captain will be selected by the respective juries.


